

# Your new Urban Recycling Service has arrived!

Council is working towards better reduction of waste in our district. In 2020, we ran two trials to understand the recycling habits of residents. We found that our towns are good at recycling the correct materials when they are provided with the tools to do so.

Therefore, in the 2021-31 Long Term Plan it was decided Council will roll out additional glass and recycling services in Dannevirke, Pahiatua, Woodville and Eketāhuna. Households in these areas will be provided with a 45L glass container and a 240L wheelie-bin for mixed recyclables, including type 1, 2 and 5 plastics, tin cans and cardboard.

These bins will be collected on alternating weeks.

#### Who gets these bins?

All properties who pay urban rates will recieve these bins. You may see your neighbour doesn't have one, this is because they are in the rural boundary.

#### How are these new bins paid for?

The improved recycling services will be funded by a combination of rates for urban properties receiving these services, revenue generated from the recycled glass, and through Central Governments waste levy.




## So what goes in my bins?

Your new 240L recycling bin is perfect for all your type 1, 2 and 5 plastics, paper, carboard and tin.

To ensure your bin can be recycled please ensure the following items are not in your bin:

- No soft plastics
  - No plastic bags
- No wet paper/cardboard
- No food waste

- No polysterene
- No fibreglass/Other
- No bottle lids
- Unrinsed plastics



Your 45L crate is perfect for recycling glass bottles and jars that you aren't going to re-purpose or reuse.

For our teams safety please refrain from over filling this crate or putting any of the following items in the black bin.

• No broken glass

- No lightbulbs
- No windows or mirrors
- No bottle lids or corks

Please note: Only Tararua District Council crates will be collected



#### Recycling is extremely important

Reducing solid waste to landfill and recycling is the single biggest thing we can do to mitigate climate change.

Rubbish in our landfills accounts for most of the Tararua District's carbon emissions, along with wastewater. Extending our recycling services will not only help to reduce harmful emissions but also the cost of sending the waste to landfills.

# Here are some tips to help you recycle

# Bins and crates must be kerbside by 7:30am.

Please ensure it is right on the kerbside and visible for our teams, so you don't get missed.

Please ensure all items are rinsed/washed clean.

To ensure your recycling is able to be processed, it is important you ensure the correct recycling is in your bin. The yellow lidded bin is for plastics (1, 2 and 5), rinsed cans, cardboard and tin. The black crate is for clean, whole glass.

Flatten your cardboard before placing it in the yellow lidded bin.

If your bin is contaminated with non-recyclables it will not be picked up. Contaminants include polystyrene, cling wrap or broken glass.

These bins belong to the property. Please don't take them with you when you move.
