ANNUAL SECTION 10A Dog Control Act 1996 Report 2022/2023

PART 1 – Dog Control Policy and Practices

Dog Control in the District

The requirements of the Dog Control Act 1996 and the Council's Dog Control Policy 2019 are monitored and enforced by the Councils Animal Control Team via a joint service agreement with the Rangitikei District Council. Two Animal Control Officers are based in Feilding covering the Manawatu with assistance from other Rangitikei officers as and when needed.

The Animal Control Team have been responding to service requests and complaints within the timeframes set by Council through its Long Term Plan and Annual Plan.

Animal Control Officers have made concerted efforts at being pro-active in the detection of offences, in particular targeting un-registered dogs and wandering dogs and responding to complaints of aggressive dog behaviour including dog attacks.

Council's approach to owners of unregistered dogs is that the Animal Control Officers conduct property inspections, owners are issued verbal or written warnings followed by the serving of an infringement notice, and as a final measure if absolutely necessary, impounding.

Selected Owner Status

An Owner may apply for Selected Owner status and if approved the owner benefits by a reduction in the annual registration fee.

In determining if an Owner qualifies for Selected Owner status Council will consider, but not be limited to, the following

- a) whether the Premises is adequately fenced;
- b) whether the dog(s) have been Neutered;
- c) the applicant's record of dog ownership, including history of compliance with the Bylaw, the Act and whether there have been any Nuisance complaints;
- d) whether the dogs have been registered before the due date; and
- e) the appropriate level of care for the dogs and whether the kennel is weatherproof, of sufficient size, clean and sanitary.

Animal Control Officers visit properties of owners applying for 'selected owners' status in the district to ensure that the properties are maintained to the appropriate standard required for this type of ownership status.

Hours of Operation

Normal working hours are 8am to 5pm on weekdays. Animal Control Officers work an on-call shift to respond to priority one calls after hours including weekends. Priority One calls include dog attacks.

Menacing and Dangerous Dogs

Animal Control maintain a list of all dogs classified as dangerous and menacing, this relating to classification by either the provisions of sections 31, 33A and/or 33C of the Dog Control Act 1996. Physical checks have occurred within this period to ensure that all dogs classified as menacing, regardless of the reason why, comply with the requirements of the classification.

During the 2022/2023 period 9 dogs have been classified as Menacing. 3 of those classifications are currently under appeal.

No dogs were classified as Dangerous in the 2022/2023 year due to aggressive behaviour by the dog or due to its breed.

Prohibited public places, dog on leash areas and dog exercise areas

There are specific areas within the Manawatu District Council area designated for exercise, lead only and prohibited areas.

Animal Control Officers approach any breaches of these requirements in an educational manner, with any issue of infringements undertaken as a last resort.

Infringements

Prosecutions

One prosecution was undertaken in the 2022/2023 year. Charges of failing to register a dog and owning a dog that attacked another dog were laid following a dog attack on another dog resulting in the death of that dog. The Defendant was convicted and the destruction of the dog was ordered by the Courts along with fines and court costs against the Defendant.

Disqualification of Owners

For the period 2022/2023, 3 owners of dogs were disqualified from owning a dog under the provisions of Sect 25 of the Dog Control Act 1996 which provides that any Owner of a dog that receives 3 or more infringements within a 24 month period must be disqualified from owning a dog for a period up to 5 years. Of those 3 disqualifications 2 are still under appeal.

Dog Registrations

There were 8268 dogs registered during the 2022/2023 year. This is an increase of 24 from the previous year.

A breakdown of the types of dog registrations is contained under Part 2 of the report.
