Bio Plant Manawatū New Zealand Limited (BPMNZ) has applied for resource consent from Horizons Regional Council to establish New Zealand's first pyrolysis plant for environmentally-friendly conversion of waste into a useable resource.

What questions will our community forum address?

- How big is the landfill problem in Aotearoa New Zealand and Manawatū, and what is needed?
- What part of the solution is BPMNZ providing?
- What is the international evidence that pyrolysis contributes to a circular economy and emissions reduction?
- What is the difference between incineration and pyrolysis?
- What safety standards has BPMNZ met?
- What steps has BPMNZ taken so far?

This forum includes brief presentations from Bio Plant Manawatū personnel and technical advisors, as well as a guest independent scientist. There will be time and opportunity for Q&A.
